## 1. Executive Board Reports

## 2. Superintendent and Administrative Updates

- a) MaryJane Garibay Superintendent
  - Superintendent MaryJane Garibay welcomed everyone to the new school year and introduced her team.
- b) Vincent Marasco Business Administrator
  - He is looking forward to the school year.
- c) Richard Beck the Director of Special Services
  - Dr. Beck spoke about the upcoming meeting being held on October 20th at 10 am in the administration building. Representatives from the Monmouth County Vocational Schools will be there to discuss various high school options.
- d) Melissa Jones the Director of Curriculum and Instruction
  - Ms. Jones thanked the PTO for the legacy gifts. The innovation labs are up and running, the tower gardens are amazing and are currently being implemented, and the students are enjoying the physical education equipment.
- e) Terri Pulitzer Technology Coordinator
  - Ms. Pulitzer discussed the amazing things happening in technology.
     There's a fleet of over 600 chrome books in the district. There's a great new STEM coach. He's a technology wizard and is going to work with the staff to assist with chrome book implementation.

## f) Tricia Barr - Primary School Principal

Ms. Barr shared the theme of the primary school, Rock and Rule. She
discussed the benefits of the Innovation Labs. They enable students to
use their creativity and enhance their learning experiences through
hands-on activities. She thanked the PTO, parents, and library volunteers
for partnering with the primary school.

## g) Mr. Osmond - Elementary School Principal

• Mr Osmond spoke about the 5th graders making a nice transition to the middle school. He spoke about the ongoing peace day celebrations - the children wearing blue, working on their pinwheels, and discussing peace in the classroom as well as in the community and the world. Mr. Osmond shared good news - there are 15 new students this year. He added that education is a collaborative effort and thanked everyone for their support. He discussed the exciting things happening at the elementary school - Innovation labs are up and running and students are super excited about the innovation labs as well as the tower gardens. 4th and 5th graders all have chrome books. There's a new STEM coach that has provided lessons to all 4th and 5th grade teachers to help utilize chrome books. He thanked everyone again for their continued support.

## h) Mr. Rigby - Cedar Drive Middle School Principal

• Mr. Rigby said they are off to a great start and gave credit to the staff. He talked about how the building has come alive now that school is back in session. He talked about a phone call he received earlier this morning. He was asked to come to a 6th grade classroom in which he saw 6th graders using legos to build motorized helicopters. The children were very excited to see their creations moving around the room. Mr. Rigby also mentioned Freehold Regional Information night, which he attended the night before. Colts Neck alumni were there and he was very impressed to see their confidence and how well they were doing. Ms. Barr, who was also there with one of her own children, added on by saying the alumni were eloquent and poised. She was impressed with the incredible Colts Neck experiences they shared and how their experiences have shaped them.

## i) MaryJane Garibay - Superintendent

- She doesn't have a finer team to work with. She views them as a family and they collaborate as professionals and on a personal level as well.
- She can't give enough praise to the PTO. The innovation labs and tower gardens are excellent tools for learning. There is nothing better than hands-on activities, student engagement, and problem-solving.
- She thanked parents for taking the time to complete the parent survey.
- Initiatives as a result of the survey:
  - Revision of K-5 report cards. There will be parent involvement/ input. It is going to be a process so changes will go into effect

2017-2018 school year. Report cards now are more of a tradition than an accurate reflection of your child's learning and progress.

- Going to take a close look at homework time spent, evaluate content.
- District and parents just received PARC data. Ms. Jones will present the district assessment data to the Colts Neck Board of Education on October 5th.
- The district is also going to work with the PTO to present meaningful presentations at the PTO meetings.
- The district is working collaboratively with Freehold Regional to see what students are doing when they leave us.

Patricia concluded the meeting by thanking administrators, staff, and parents for coming to the meeting and for all that they do for the PTO. This upcoming year, every student is going to have their hands on something donated by the PTO.
